Authentic (The Real You)

This is the third session in this series. "Authentic" The dictionary defines Authentic as:

- Not false or copied; genuine; real
- Having an origin supported by unquestionable evidence; authenticated; verified:
- Representing one's true nature or beliefs; true to oneself or to the person identified:

This week we are talking about "The Real You"

I ask this question a lot, and I have to ask it again today:

- Do you trust The Bible as God's Word
- Do you believe it is a "Living Word", applying to us today
- Or do you think it is simply a book of history

Before you answer, let's look at a couple of familiar verses:

Jeremiah 1:4-5

4 Then the word of the Lord came to me, saying:

5 "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you;

Before you were born I sanctified you;

I ordained you a prophet to the nations."

Jeremiah 29:11

11 For I know the thoughts that I think toward you, says the Lord, thoughts of peace and not of evil, to give you a future and a hope.

Did you realize that Jeremiah was very insecure, felt he was too young and ill equipped to do what God told him to do?

- Do you think God missed it when He called Jeremiah
- Or do you believe God had a specific purpose for him, and designed Jeremiah specifically for his unique calling?

Now the reason I ask you this is simple:

- Are these verses just for Jeremiah
- Or do you believe these verses apply to each of us in our lives
- That God purposely designed and equips each of us
- That we have a predestined future/ function for our lives

I hope you do believe that...

A few weeks ago we looked at the word "Hypocrite":

- An actor/stage player
- Pretending to be someone you are not

In the last two sessions we talked about that very thing in Acts 8 with Simon the Sorcerer:

- Presented himself as the real power of God
- But was just a fake

I'm going to let you in on something:

- God don't like fake!!
- He loves the real you!!!
- The one He designed!!

Psalm 139:1-14 God's Perfect Knowledge of Man 139 O Lord, You have searched me and known me. 2 You know my sitting down and my rising up; You understand my thought afar off. 3 You comprehend my path and my lying down, And are acquainted with all my ways. 4 For there is not a word on my tongue, But behold, O Lord, You know it altogether. 5 You have hedged me behind and before, And laid Your hand upon me. 6 Such knowledge is too wonderful for me; It is high, I cannot attain it. 7 Where can I go from Your Spirit? Or where can I flee from Your presence? 8 If I ascend into heaven, You are there; If I make my bed in hell, behold, You are there. 9 If I take the wings of the morning, And dwell in the uttermost parts of the sea, 10 Even there Your hand shall lead me, And Your right hand shall hold me. 11 If I say, "Surely the darkness shall fall on me," Even the night shall be light about me; 12 Indeed, the darkness shall not hide from You, But the night shines as the day;

The darkness and the light are both alike to You.

13 For You formed my inward parts;

You covered me in my mother's womb.

14 I will praise You, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made;

Marvelous are Your works,

And that my soul knows very well.

Fearfully and wonderfully made:

- Made with great care
- Set apart from others

Can you embrace the fact that God didn't design you to be like anyone else...

Sure you may have imperfections, or weaknesses, but as God told Paul:

- "My strength is made perfect in weakness" (2 Cor. 12:9)
- Your imperfections show "The Real you"
- And they are an opportunity for people to see the authentic power of God working through you!!

Just look at some examples of Real People God used:

- Abraham: An idol makers son
- Jacob: a trickster/deceiver
- Moses: A murderer with a speech problem
- Gideon: hiding in the winepress, had to question God 3 times
- Jonah: Ran from his calling
- Peter: rash and impulsive
- James and John: a couple of hot heads (Son's of Thunder)
- Matthew: a tax collector
- Thomas: was a doubter
- Paul: a Pharisee

One thing all of these men had in common:

• They were all specifically designed by God for their unique purpose

I'm not saying a person won't be changed...

2 Corinthians 5:17

17 Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new.

- That means the sin in your life goes away
- Thought patterns change

- Personality doesn't necessarily change
- You are still you
- The you that God designed
- The you that God chose

Don't try to be anybody else... Don't feel like you have to put on some kind of show for other people

Luke 18:9-14

9 Also He spoke this parable to some who trusted in themselves that they were righteous, and despised others: 10 "Two men went up to the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. 11 The Pharisee stood and prayed thus with himself, 'God, I thank You that I am not like other men—extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even as this tax collector. 12 I fast twice a week; I give tithes of all that I possess.' 13 And the tax collector, standing afar off, would not so much as raise his eyes to heaven, but beat his breast, saying, 'God, be merciful to me a sinner!' 14 I tell you, this man went down to his house justified rather than the other; for everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted."

- You don't have to pray like everybody else
- You don't have to sing like everyone else
- You don't have to dress like everyone else
- You don't have to preach like everyone else
- You don't have to try to impress everyone else

10 Am I now trying to win the approval of human beings, or of God? Or am I trying to please people? If I were still trying to please people, I would not be a servant of Christ.
